ASEAN AGREEMENT ON THE MOVEMENT OF NATURAL PERSONS

SINGAPORE'S SCHEDULE OF MOVEMENT OF NATURAL PERSONS COMMITMENTS

1. Singapore's commitments under Article 6 (Schedules of Commitments for the Temporary Entry and Temporary Stay of Natural Persons) in relation to the supply of a service supplier of one Member State through presence of natural persons of a Member State in the territory of another Member State apply only in relation to the categories of persons set out below.

2. In accordance with Article 6 (Schedules of Commitments for the Temporary Entry and Temporary Stay of Natural Persons) for the categories of persons set out in this Schedule, Singapore specifies below the general conditions and limitations in relation to the supply of a service by a service supplier of a Member State through the presence of natural persons of a Member State in the territory of Singapore.

 (i) an Executive: a natural person within the organisation who primarily directs the management of the organisation and exercises wide latitude in decision making and receives only general supervision or 	
direction from higher level executives, the board of directors, or stockholders of the business; an executive would not directly perform tasks related to the actual provision of the service or services of the organisation;	

(ii) a Manager : a natural person within
the organisation who primarily
directs the
organisation/department/subdivision
and exercises supervisory and
control functions over other
supervisory, managerial or
professional staff; does not include
first line supervisors unless
employees supervised are
professionals; does not include
employees who primarily perform
tasks necessary for the provision of
the service; or
(iii) a Specialist : a natural person
within the organisation who
possesses knowledge at an
advanced level of expertise essential
to the establishment/provision of the
service and/or possesses proprietary
knowledge of the organisation's
service, research equipment,
techniques or management; may
include, but is not limited to,
members of a licensed profession.

3. Notwithstanding the commitments set out above, Singapore remains unbound with respect to National Treatment and ships' crews.
