January 1992	Singapore	ASEAN leaders mandated the creation of the ASEAN Free Trade Area (AFTA) within 15 years <i>Involves a comprehensive program of tariff reduction in the region to be carried out in phases</i>
15 December 1995	Bangkok	ASEAN ministers signed the ASEAN Framework Agreement on Services (AFAS)* <i>Involves the implementation of measures that will facilitate free flow of services in the region</i>
December 1997	Kuala Lumpur	ASEAN leaders decided on the ASEAN Vision 2020 <i>Envisages ASEAN as a stable, prosperous, and highly competitive region, with equitable economic development and reduced poverty and socio-economic disparities</i>
7 October 1998	Manila	ASEAN ministers signed the Framework Agreement on the ASEAN Investment Area (AIA) <i>Encourages investors to adopt a regional investment strategy and network of operations</i>
31 January 2003		AFTA became fully operational with the signing of the Protocol to amend the Common Effective Preferential Tariff (CEPT) Agreement <i>Provides for the elimination of 60% of tariffs in the ASEAN inclusion list</i>
07 October 2003	Bali	ASEAN leaders declared the ASEAN Economic Community (AEC) as the goal of regional economic integration <i>Identifies AEC as among the 3 pillars of the ASEAN Community</i>
9 December 2005	Kuala Lumpur	Mutual Recognition Arrangement (MRA)* on Engineering Services signed
August 2006	Kuala Lumpur	ASEAN leaders agreed to develop the AEC Blueprint <i>Identifies the characteristics and elements of the AEC by 2015 with targets and timelines for implementation</i>
8 December 2006	Cebu	MRA on Nursing Services signed
13 January 2007	Cebu	ASEAN leaders signed the Cebu Declaration <i>Accelerates the establishment of the AEC from 2020 to 2015</i>
19 November 2007	Singapore	Signed were MRAs on the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Architectural Services • QS Qualification signed
20 November 2007	Singapore	ASEAN leaders adopted the AEC Blueprint

18 November 2012	Phnom Penh	ASEAN shares the Mid-Term Review of the implementation of AEC Blueprint presented <i>Presents achievements in AEC measures and recommendations in moving forward</i>
